

"PRINCESS MAGGIE," SISTER OF INDIAN KING, DIES ON L. I.

**Was One of Three Survivors of
Original King of Montauks.**

Easthampton, L. I., May 12—Margaret Newins, known as the Princess Maggie, died at her home in Easthampton, Friday. She was one of the Pharaohs, and a sister of the late King Wyandank Pharaoh of the Montauk Indians. Her forebears are buried at Indian Field, Montauk, but the tribal acres were sold in the seventies, and the interment of the princess was made in Cedar Lawn Cemetery, Easthampton. Of the 14 Pharaoh children, who trace their ancestry back to Wyandank, the sachem who ruled the Montauks in 1650, when Easthampton town was settled, only two survive, Samuel Powhattan and Princess Pocahontas. Dowager Queen Maria, now an old woman, lives at Freetown, the settlement near Easthampton, where the Montauk Indians were domiciled after the Bensons, of Brooklyn, bought the Indian Fields in 1879. Princess Maggie was 58 years old.
