

PRINCESS OLLIE, OF MONTAUK TRIBE, DIES

Descendants of King Wyandanch Bury Her Regally.

Easthampton, L. I., Jan. 17—Funeral services for royalty were held at St. Luke's P. E. Church here when obsequies for Ollie, a sister of Dowager Queen Maria of the Montauk Tribe of Indians died. Although the Montauk tribe has been held by the courts legally inexistant, due to intermarriage with Ethiopians and dwindling numbers, the tribal relatives of Ollie went right ahead and made all burial arrangements regardless and before notifying local authorities. They sent for Dean Treder of the Garden City Cathedral and instructed him to secure a sepecial organist. The clergyman at St. Luke's is from North Carolina. He was quite impressed by the airs and graces of the royal tribal descendants of King Wyandanch. Dean Treder motored down for the funeral, are applying for permission from the present rector. A grand ceremonial was held n St. Luke's. Princess Ollie was the widow of Samuel Butler. She left no will and the royal residence, a dwelling at Freetown, descends to her nine children.

Tribal councils of Montauk Indians are held at Sag Harbor. Wyandank Pharaoh is titular head of the tribe and is known as "King" Dank. His queen is Florence.
