TO HONOR INDIAN CHIEF.

Montauk, L. I., Dec. 23—The suggestion has been made by a historian that a monument be erected to Wyandance, chief of the Montauk Indians from 1640 to 1659, who was the friend of the white man and who prevented clashes between tribes of the Confederated Long Island Indians, of whom he was over-sachem, and the English. Wyandance died mysteriously, it is thought, of poison, administered by an enemy. His grave is unmarked and his memory unhonored by any permanent testimonial.
