SENATE CONFIRMS BLACKMAR.

Grady and McCarren Attack Governor for His Appointment.

ALBANY, Jan. 13.—Gov. Hughes's appointment of Abel E. Blackmar to be Justice of the Supreme Court to succeed Judge Willard Bartlett, elected to the Court of Appeals, was confirmed by the Senate to-night by a party vote, except in the case of Senator Fuller, Independent Democrat, who voted with the Republicans.

In the course of the debate a bitter attack was made upon the Governor by Senators Grady and McCarren. To name Mr. Blackmar, a Republican, to the position held by Justice Bartlett, a Democrat, was, the Senators asserted, partisanship of the most offensive kind. The question came up when the Judiciary Committee reported in favor of the confirmation of the appointment.
